At a minimum it is a financial strain/burden not to mention a stressful situation for our parents/caregivers to navigate on their own. As a Board Member and a parent.... I see the mission that CAMP provides is just as important and needed to support and assist our parents & caregivers as it is for our campers themselves.

We are a 501(c)(3) local non-profit organization, established in 2007, committed to offering specialized services for adults with diverse abilities after high school. Since our founding, we have accumulated over 270,000 man-hours of collaborative work aimed at fostering the development of adults with different abilities while providing respite for their families.

Our influence reaches throughout the community, as we support caregivers in maintaining employment, thereby reducing the risk of unemployment due to their responsibilities in caring for special education graduates.

In the Rio Grande Valley, there are very few organizations like C.A.M.P. Now, as we celebrate our 17th year of service, we acknowledge the increasing prevalence of autism and developmental disorders, recognizing the thousands of individuals we need to serve and the decades of work that lie ahead.

Typically, a service like ours would cost families over \$1,100 per month, a burden that many in our Valley demographic cannot afford. To address this, we actively engage in fundraising efforts to subsidize 67% of the tuition costs for our families, making our services more attainable.

Our event, A Night at the Races, aims to raise the majority of funds needed to sustain our mission. Due to our growth, we have welcomed two new teachers and continue to expand rapidly!
